**HEALTH TIP**

**Vision - part 1** - More than one million Americans at or over age 40 are blind. Vision impairment creates problems for an additional 2.4 million. As Baby Boomers age, these numbers are expected to double. Your vision naturally changes as you age but medical conditions can cause additional vision losses. Your vision loss may be a difficulty with either the central or peripheral fields. It might be blurred vision, light sensitivity, night blindness, or even a hazy vision. Visit an eye care professional if you have difficulty with: close-up work or reading, determining colors, reading signs, or recognizing friends from a short distance, like across the parking lot. It is important to determine if your problem can be treated with a pair of glasses or if it is **disease related** requiring surveillance and additional treatment. An early diagnosis of glaucoma, cataracts, macular degeneration, or diabetic retinopathy will make a huge difference in managing your vision.
